GREEN TRAVEL POLICY

The King's Centre operates a Green Travel Policy, working in partnership with Oxford City Council to reduce traffic congestion and benefit the local community. We greatly appreciate you working with us.

PARK AND RIDE

There are 5 Park & Ride services operating around Oxford, with easy access from the motorways. The nearest is the Seacourt, just off the A34 Botley Interchange. The next most convenient is the Thornhill, on the east side of the city. Parking and journey fees apply. Please check the Park and Ride website for most current prices. Buses run every 15-20 minutes. You will need to get off at the Osney Island bus stop on Botley Road, from where The King's Centre is just a 5-10 minute walk along the Thames towpath (marked by a dotted line on our map.)

BY BUS

The nearest bus stop to The King's Centre is the Osney Island stop on Botley Road, from where The King's Centre is just a 5-10 minute walk along the Thames towpath (marked by a dotted line on our map). Botley Road is served by a variety of local buses - you can get on any number 4, S1 or U1 bus.

BY RAIL

The King's Centre is just a 10 - 15 minute walk from Oxford rail station, marked on our map.

FROM LONDON HEATHROW/GATWICK

There are regular coach services from these airports and bus stops around London to the Gloucester Green coach station in Oxford City Centre, from where The King's Centre is just a 15 - 20 minute walk.

CYCLING

The King's Centre provides undercover and secure bicycle racks for visitors. If you cycle round Oxford or would like to bring your bike on the train, The King's Centre is next to the Thames towpath (marked by a dotted line on our map), which is suitable for bicycles.

WALKING

If you live in Oxford and prefer to walk, The King's Centre can be accessed by the Thames towpath from Folly Bridge or Osney Island. This is marked by a dotted line on our map.

BY CAR

In order to help reduce traffic congestion at peak travel times in Oxford City Centre, we ask delegates to find alternative means of travelling to The King's Centre. There are a limited number of parking permits available for each booking so if you need to park on site, please contact your event organiser in advance to request a permit.

FROM LONDON AND THE SOUTH EAST

- Take Junction 8 off the M40 towards Oxford
- Take the A40 to Oxford
- At the roundabout continue on the A40 (ring road), following the signs to stay on the ringroad onto the A34 southbound.
- Come off at the Botley Interchange.

FROM THE NORTH

- Take Junction 9 off the M40
- Follow the A34 southbound to the Botley Interchange

FROM M4/A34

- Take Junction 13 off the M4 at Chieveley
- Follow the A34 northbound to the Botley Interchange

FROM THE BOTLEY INTERCHANGE

- Follow the signs for Oxford city centre
- At McDonald's turn left onto the A420 towards the city centre
- After about 0.7 miles, turn right at the traffic lights onto Ferry Hinksey Road
- At the mini roundabout turn left
- The King's Centre is on your left after about 300m
